Stephen Bury, Head of European and American Collections at the British Library, has accepted the invitation to be the next Andrew W Mellon Chief Librarian at the Frick Art Reference Library in New York where he will be responsible for directing its public library, archives, photographic archives, digital imaging and the Centre for The History of Collecting in America. Stephen has worked at the British Library since 2000, first as Head of Modern English Collections, and then since 2002 as Head of European and American Collections.

Following JISC Collections' acquisition of Content Complete Ltd towards the end of last year, the Senior Management Team for the merged company is in place. **Lorraine Estelle** is CEO, JISC Collections. **Ryan Curry**, as Head of Finance, is responsible for financial planning and control and all financial matters relating to the JISC Collections Helpdesk and Subscription Service. **Liam Earney** leads the Licensing and Customer Service activity across all NESLi2 and JISC Collections' agreements as Head of Licensing and Customer Service. **Paul Harwood** is Deputy CEO,

supporting Lorraine in the strategic planning and implementation of JISC Collections activities with a focus on business development.

Caren Milloy is Head of Projects and will programme manage the JISC Collections' extensive range of projects and initiatives.

At LYRASIS, which was formed last year by the merger of PALINET and SOLINET and joined shortly thereafter by NELINET to form the largest regional membership organization serving libraries and information professionals in the US, two major appointments have been announced. In January, **Arnold Hirshon** was appointed Chief Strategist and Executive Consultant and will lead the new Library Executive Advisor Program (LEAP). Arnold will provide executive coaching and education services geared specifically for library directors and senior managers. In April, **Tom Sanville** joins as Director of Licensing and Negotiation and will oversee all vendor licensing, programmes, and strategic partnerships at LYRASIS, including the management of the electronic resources portfolio and supervision of the

lis-e-resources is now being managed temporarily by the joint editor of *Serials*, **Hazel Woodward** (University Librarian and Director of the University Press at Cranfield University) and *The E-Resources Management Handbook* editor-in-chief, **Graham Stone** (Electronic Resources Manager at the University of Huddersfield).

At the Department of Health (DH), **Pek Lan Bower** retires in April after 28 years in the DH/DHSS and nearly 12 years as its Chief Librarian. In 2003, Pek



Lan received an OBE for her contribution to the department's library and information services.

Antony Osborne takes over as the new Head of Library Services. Antony was previously the Academic Librarian (Education, Music, Humanities and Media) at the University of Huddersfield and joined DH in February. The DH Library in London relocated to Leeds at the end of 2007 with a small professional team left in Skipton House. In March, the London team will be disbanded and all services will be delivered from Leeds.



Other recent changes in DH include temporary promotions to Librarian for **Craig Abbs** who is the new Electronic Resources, Systems and Acquisitions Librarian; **Helen Morgan**, now the Database Librarian and **Samantha Emmott** who is now the Customer Services Librarian.
